George Adams was born Nov. 14, 1898, at Kirwin, Kansas, and moved to Woodward County with his parents in the fall of 1899. Josephine, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. L. J. Hopkins, was born in this county April 9, 1907. They were married in Woodward in 1923 by H. B. King and moved to a farm six miles west and two south of Sharon.

Emeth Billingsley was third in a family of seven children. He attended local district schools and assisted his father on the home farm. When he was twenty-two, he engaged in farming independently. In May, 1898, he left the family homestead and on horseback came to Woodward County, where he filed on a homestead southeast of where Mutual is now located.

They moved to Canadian, Texas, where Mr. Bellows was a foreman on the Santa Fe Railroad out of Woodward until he retired and moved to his farm eighteen miles southwest of Woodward. The family lived in a dugout for a while until their new home was built. Mr.

After arriving in Woodward County, four more children were born: Elmer, Bill, Anna (Mrs. Billy Metzger) and Cora. Mrs. Bowlby passed away in 1929 and Mr. Bowlby in 1934. In 1937 the claim was sold to Mr. and Mrs. Earl R. Smith.

THE BARNES FAMILY. The first member of the Barnes family to arrive in Woodward County was F. E. (Frank) Barnes, who rode a bicycle from Lincoln, Nebraska, to Woodward about 1908. He built a one-room rock house about fifteen miles northeast of Woodward in the Willard area and started farming.
